Substantive Knowledge - Agreed key facts

Class name: Nightingale Year group(s): 1/2 Term: Autumn 1 Topic: You're Great Britain

English: Traditional Tales: Little Red Riding Hood. (The Write Stuff)

This term we will look at the features
of traditional tales and write a version
of our own. We will use the book
'Little Red Riding Hood'

Geography: You're Great Britain - Why is Britain Great?

In this unit the children look at a contrasting UK locality. Children learn the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and the surrounding seas. They look at physical and human features of capital cities and use simple maps to plan a day out in each city at different times of the year. They will begin to express views and opinions about places.

Reading: Children will continue with daily phonics/spelling through the RWI programme. Those who have completed will take part in Accelerated Reader.

Science: Plants

To observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. Find and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy(yr2)

To identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants including trees.

To identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants including deciduous and evergreen trees(yr1)

Art and Design: Drawing

Unit 1: Make your mark.

Exploring mark making and line: working and experimenting with different materials through observational and collaborative pieces.

Handwriting:

Looking at letter and number formation. Focus on different letter families and how they are formed using cursive writing.

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Disciplinary Knowledge - Agreed key skills

Class name: Nightingale Year group(s): 1/2 Term: Autumn 1 Topic: You're Great Britain.

English:

The children will learn to write effective sentences to help write their own version of the story Little Red Riding Hood. They will learn how to use adjectives, dialogue, similes. They will use alliteration and onomatopoeia.

The children will continue focus on punctuation including capital letters and full stops, commas, speech marks, question and exclamation marks.

Geography:

Identify land and water on a map Identify country boundaries on a map Geographical scale: Our country is at the national scale Location & place: Countries and capital cities of the UK; some human and physical features of the UK Interconnections: Humans are affected by physical features everyday (e.g. weather)

Maths:

To know Number bonds to 10 (1) to 20, 50 ,100 (2)

Counting in 3's (2)

Counting in 2's, 5's and 10's (2)

Using number frames to support tens and ones when adding and subtracting a 2-digit number with a 1-digit number.

PSHE & RSE:

Unit 1 – Religious Understanding introduces children to the story from the Gospel of Matthew, when Jesus welcomed all of the little children to come to Him. The five-story sessions encourage children to understand that they are created by God out of love and for love. Children will revisit this Gospel story at the end of this Module.

RE:

Some children will be able to **talk about** their experience and feelings about the roles of people within families. Some children will be able to say what they **wonder** about the care given to people within families. Some children will be able to **ask and respond to** questions about the difference between families.

PE:

To practice and develop accuracy of rolling, striking and receiving skills. To strike a ball with own hand. To roll a ball underarm for partner to strike using a racket.

Music.

The children will learn about the dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc), singing and playing instruments are all linked. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with this song, children will listen and appraise different styles of South African music.

Key vocabulary:

Locality,rural, urban, coastal, human features, boundaries

Science:

Children will be able to name trees and other plants they see regularly.

Describe key features of the trees and plants e.g. shapes of leaves/colour of the flower/blossom. Point out trees which lost their leaves and those who keep them all year. Point to and name parts of a plant. Use simple charts to sort. Can use photos to talk about how plants change (yr1) Children will be able to describe how plants that have grown from seeds and bulbs have developed over time.

Identify plants that grew well in different conditions. Spot similarities and differences between bulbs and seeds.

Can nurture seeds and bulbs into mature plants identifying the different requirements of different plants.

Art and Design:

The children will be using different types of lines to create art. They will learn how to use different media to create various types of lines. They will be linking their work to artists Bridget Riley, Zaria Forman and Kandinsky
