<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A large proportion of the money has been spent on the membership to the Plymouth Schools Partnership (PSSP). This provides much of the provision and support for school PE and Sports. This 'core offer' includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Bikeability, Coaching Days, access to local and level 2 competitions (including SEN), website membership, MTA and Play Leader training; ○ Specialist PE teachers (formerly Schools Sports Coordinators) to work with and alongside primary teachers where support has been identified (KS1 CPD opportunities); ○ Local 'family' run festivals and competitions in line with the New National Curriculum; ○ Support (through secondary leadership) for level 1 and 2 school competitions; ○ Accessibility to specific resources such as: wireless dance mats, rowing machines, mini bus hire and various 'Top Bags' of equipment; ○ Leadership courses for primary aged children to develop leadership skills (Bronze Ambassadors); ○ Regular updates on up and coming initiatives, opportunities and developments; ○ Assistance with the planning, preparation and delivery of School Games Day (formerly Sports Day) using Silver Ambassadors to support Bronze Ambassadors. • Develop playground leadership and engagement in physical activity through employing 'Play Rangers' to deliver a range of quality activities at lunchtimes; Bronze Ambassadors to deliver weekly 'Play Ground Challenges' • Establish links with secondary 'Sports Leadership' students to develop and support 'Sport Leaders' in the playground; • To employ certified Sports Coaches to provide quality first teaching of PE and Games to all KS2; • Swimming provision through a 3-week intensive course at Plymouth Life Centre for Years 4 and 5; • Provide out of hour learning provision through the hiring of rugby, dance and football coaches. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improved quality of teaching and learning in a variety of PE and Games lessons; • Increased varied opportunities for all children to experience competition; • Improved leadership skills of children at playtimes and within lessons, through leading warm ups and delivering playground challenges; • Improvement in delivery and attainment in dance, gym and outdoor adventure; • All children achieving a '25m swimming' distance; • Increased participation in level 2 and above competitions (where achievable) with aspirations to reach level 3 inter-county competitions.
