## Literacy:

Continue to read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending.

Write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others.

## Understanding the World:

Continue to explore the natural world within our local area (school), making observations, drawing pictures and labelling parts of plants and trees.

#### Mathematics - Power Maths Reception

#### Counting on and counting back:

Count forwards and backwards between 1 and 10 Use a 1-10 number track to count on or count back Add or take away numbers using a first, then, now story structure

Explain how they know what number to start on, how many jumps to make on the number line and how to identify the answer

#### Numbers to 20

Confidently count forwards and backwards to 20 Accurately count an irregular set of up to 20 objects

Identify one more and one less than a given number to 20

Use vocabulary such as more and fewer to compare numbers and quantities

Use a range of resources to represent given numbers **Numerical Patterns** 

Use concrete manipulatives to double and halve

numbers

Show why a number is odd or even Identify doubles to double 5

Explain that even numbers can be shared into two equal groups and odd numbers cannot

Hallve even numbers to 10 by sharing into two equal groups

#### Year 1 Multiplication

Count reliably in steps of 2, 5 and 10 Use concrete, pictorial and abstract representations to find the total of a given number of equal groups Create arrays based on the numbers given to them Solve word problems,

#### Division

Make a given number of equal groups from a given total, or share a given total equally among a given number of groups

Use concrete resources and pictures to represent their method of division and explain clearly Record both types of division using a number line. Solve word problems

### Halves and Quarters

Use efficient strategies to find halves and quarters of shapes and groups of objects

Find equal parts and they will know how the equal parts relate to the whole.

Use the correct vocabulary and reasoning when explaining their methods, particularly when solving word problems.
