

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## English:

To use and understand the following terms.

Negative adjectives, Suffix -ly, est, Precise adjectives, Conjunctions, Exclamation marks, Personification, Precise verbs, Onomatopoeia and Fronted adverbials.

## Art:

To use a range of techniques to create pictures. To learn how to weave using paper. Using paper weave skills, they will create handmade heart bags. To use wax to transfer design to fabric. To carefully use a paintbrush to apply dye to the wax-resist.

## History:

To use ICT skills and books to find out about the life of Samuel Pepys. To write about the key events of the Great Fire of London. To reflect upon and evaluate what has been discovered about the Great Fire of London.

## Class text:

Poetry (A.A.Milne) I do not mind you Winter Wind. (J.Prelutsky) Where the Wild Things are. (M. Sendak)

#### Maths:

To read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs. To represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20. solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems such as 7 = 2 - 9.

solve problems with addition and subtraction using concrete objects and pictorial representations, including those involving numbers, quantities and measures

## Geography:

To use maps to gather information about the local area. To use a key to locate places/landmarks on a map. To use simple compass directions N, E, S, W To plot a simple route on a map. To ask simple geographical questions.

## PSHE & RSE:

The children will know how to keep themselves safe especially online and what to do/ talk should they come across something that makes them feel unsafe.

## Key vocabulary:

Compass, direction, map, symbol, key, familiar, community

#### RE:

To know that a community is an essential and enjoyable part of life for people of every age and faith.

To know the Church's celebrations are community occasions. On Sundays, the parish family gathers together.

## PE: Gymnastics

The children will develop fundamental movement skills. They will learn to extend agility, balance and coordination. They will engage in co-operative physical activities.

## Games: Argyle in the community.

To master basic movement including running, jumping, throwing and catching. To develop agility and coordination. To develop simple tactics for attacking and defending.

## Music:

To discover how they can enjoy moving to music by dancing, marching, being animals or pop stars. To sing and play our instruments.

Opportunities for home learning: IXL online, weekly spelling words. Daily reading/Accelerated reader. Number bonds.

#### Science:

To test properties of materials and how they can be used effectively. The children will be carrying out an investigation of which material would be best to protect Humpty Dumpty. To perform simple tests. To make and use observations to answer scientific questions. To make a prediction and suggest a reason. To suggest how a simple test could be made fair.

# DT:

To use a range of materials creatively to design and make a product. To use ideas, experiences and imagination. They will create their own fabric face which they will evaluate.
