ATTENDANCE

We would like to bring your attention to attendance and punctuality.

As a school, we expect a minimum of 95% attendance to enable the children to make good progress both academically and socially. **Good attendance at school is not just beneficial it is essential.**

We review patterns of absence on a weekly basis. If your child is absent, we may ask you to supply a form of medical evidence (doctors note / medical card or copy of the prescription) for our attendance records. There are, of course, always exceptional circumstances, including long term illness and bereavement, and we will continue to take these into consideration on a case by case basis.

LATENESS

Did you know that being 15 minutes late each day is the same as missing two weeks of school over the year. Lateness is just as serious as non-attendance. The start of the school day is an important time for children to develop their social skills with their peers, as well as preparing them for their learning. <u>From January, the gate will open at 08.30 am and children will go straight to their classroom.</u>

We do understand that there are sometimes reasons as to why a child may be late but all children, where possible, need to arrive on time via the playground entrance. Lateness not only affects the individual child—is also has an impact on the other children in class.
