Staff has regular CPD and training updates. The school can access resources for the whole school, e.g. Bikeability, Balanceability, Indoor Rowing, dance mats and Teaching & Planning support from a PE Specialist teacher.

- Profile of PE to be sustained and developed to further promote engagement in healthy, active lifestyles through Twitter account @StPetersRCSPORT, Class Dojo and example of #SPSLeaders;
 - Provision of a targeted C4L club for pupils who may benefit from boosts to self-confidence and self-esteem.
- Sustained engagement with Level 2 School Games competitions through the Plymouth SSP with aspirations for progression to Level 3 competitions (e.g. Devon Winter School Games (e.g. Cross Country; Quicksticks Hockey; High 5 Netball) and Devon Summer School Games (e.g. Tri Golf; Quadkids, Mini Reds Tennis);
 - Year 6 to receive Bronze Ambassadors training prior to #SchoolGames Day during National School Sports Week (26th -30th June);
- Involvement with Bike It Plus initiative, including Big Pedal, Active Travel Crew and other special events to promote healthy, sustainable travel to and from school;
 - Playground revamp to inspire self-directed play and a legacy to continue beyond the provision of Sports Premium funding;
 - Cross-curricular links between PE and other subjects i.e. through Maths of the Day, Real PE, etc;
- CPD for MTAs and TAs to assist in the provision of activity-rich lunchtimes and Playground Challenges alongside Sports Leaders.
